CDE Foundation and Dairymen's Award Scholarship Recipients *\$30,000 awarded for undergraduate education scholarships*

Harrisburg, Pa. – The Center for Dairy Excellence Foundation and Pennsylvania Dairymen's Association selected ten undergraduate students as recipients of the 2017 Student Leader Scholarship awards. Each of the recipients will receive a \$3,000 scholarship to support their undergraduate studies to pursue a career in the dairy industry.

"We were very pleased with the overall quality of this year's applicants, and these ten individuals exemplify the caliber of leaders we have as dairy's next generation here in Pennsylvania," said Jayne Sebright, executive director of the Center for Dairy Excellence.

Pennsylvania Dairymen's Association Executive Director David Smith adds, "The Dairymen's Association is committed to helping our future dairy leaders develop skills and education to lead the Pennsylvania Dairy industry in to the future. We look forward to seeing the future accomplishment of this outstanding group of students."

This scholarship was designed to recognize, encourage and financially assist superior students enrolled in dairy related academic programs. Eight of the scholarships have been generously funded by the Pennsylvania Dairymen's Association, with the other two funded by the Center for Dairy Excellence Foundation.

This year's recipients include:

Hannah Hunsberger, who is a sophomore studying plant science at The Pennsylvania State University. Hannah is the daughter of David and Christina Hunsberger of Mifflintown, Juniata County. This summer, she is completing an internship with the USDA Pasture Systems and Watershed Management Research Office. Upon graduation, she plans to dedicate time to a service term with ECHO, an international agriculture ministry. Hannah then plans to either return to her family's dairy farm, or work as a crop consultant within the dairy industry.

Zane Patrick Itle, who is a junior studying animal science at The Pennsylvania State University. Growing up on a 200-milking cow dairy farm in Loretto, Cambria County, he is the son of Dan and Machele Itle. From working on his family's farm, Zane has experience in not only operating a dairy, but also with dairy processing plants. His family packages and delivers their milk, ice cream, butter and yogurt products. After graduation, Zane plans on becoming the fourth-generation partner and co-owner of his family's farm and dairy processing plant.



Jacob Kline, who will be a freshman studying agricultural business at Morrisville State College. Growing up on a 215-milking cow dairy farm where he has started his own herd, Jacob is the son of John and Sharon Kline of Myerstown, Lebanon County. He recently completed his term of as the 2016-2017 Pennsylvania FFA State Vice President. Upon graduation, Jacob plans to return to his family's farm as well as working in an agriculture company as a business representative.

Greg Kowalewski, who is a senior studying animal science at The Pennsylvania State University. He is the son of John and Judy Kowalewski of Forest City, Susquehanna County. As a student at Penn State, Greg is involved in the Dairy Science Club, the Penn State Meats Lab, and is a brother of Delta Theta Sigma. After graduation, he plans on either working as a herdsman or filling a consulting role to work directly with producers.

Sandra Krone, who is a junior studying dairy science at Virginia Tech. She is the daughter of Jerry and Amy Krone of Fountainville, Bucks County. While at Virginia Tech, Sandra is involved in the Dairy Club and will be an ambassador for Virginia Tech's College of Agriculture and Life Sciences. Upon graduation, she plans on owning a small business while operating an independent mating service for local farms.

Kelly MacRae, who is a sophomore studying animal science at The Pennsylvania State University. Growing up on a dairy and beef farm, she is the daughter of Robert and Sherry MacRae of Grove City, Mercer County. As a Penn State student, she is involved with the PSU STEM Club while being active in two undergraduate research programs. Kelly is also a recipient of the Ann Wannsack Award. After graduation, Kelly plans on obtaining her Doctorate of Veterinary Medicine.
