Mason-Faith grew up raising and showing beef cattle and meat goats, and she has been involved in communicating with dairy producers in her previous roles.

Joining the Center's dedicated team to serve Pennsylvania dairy farmers aligns perfectly with my values," Mason-Faith shared. She grew up showing in her county's 4-H Fair and began working at Delaware Valley University's dairy farm her freshman year.
