## An update on Pennsylvania milk markets:

If there's one thing that's certain, it's that milk prices are volatile. And in recent years, that volatility has picked up steam.

Though we are now several years removed from the COVID-19 pandemic, the extreme price movements that were a hallmark of 2020 and 2021 are still present in today's markets. While the first half of this year brought several months of Class III prices around \$16 per hundredweight, the end of the year is trading closer to \$20.

That begs the question: Will the rest of the year look more like \$20 milk or \$16?

Here's what we're keeping an eye on as the second half unfolds.

One of the big-ticket news items in 2024: multiple months of record cheese exports. In the first five months of the year, U.S. exporters shipped nearly 500 million pounds – 110 million pounds more than in 2023. It's this export action that was partly to thank for the jump in Class III prices from \$16 to \$20 per hundredweight.

Cheese prices in late 2023 had a lot to do with the U.S' export wins here in 2024. At the end of last year, U.S. cheese prices were the lowest in the world, trading in the \$1.40-to-\$1.60-per-pound range. International buyers took notice, picking up more U.S. cheese and helping to clear our market and push U.S. cheese prices up into the \$1.80 to \$2.00 per pound range. As we look to the end of the year, it's tough not to

wonder if we can maintain our record cheese exports. Today's prices are no longer the cheapest in the world if anything, we're on par to, or slightly above. That will make it difficult to find export business and clear domestic cheese markets. If cheese can't be sold overseas, then it will likely keep a ceiling on Class III prices.

Switching Class IV, or the price of milk that turns into butter and non-

fat dry milk, pricing volatility hasn't been quite as extreme.

Class IV prices have been elevated for more than a year. and the current futures curve forecasts prices above \$20 through the first half of next year.

U.S. nonfat markets are currently on par, to trading premium, to the rest of the world. The U.S. exports about half of the nonfat dry milk (NDM) it produces, and through May, U.S. NDM exports struggled to keep up with prior-year volumes. Even though there's not a lot of excess powder laying around the market, will limited price competitiveness and overall demand lethargy keep export activity subdued?

In Pennsylvania, the majority of marketed milk is priced off Class III and Class IV milk in equal parts. A \$1 move in CME Class III impacts the Pennsylvania blend price by about \$0.50 per hundredweight.

It's important that Pennsylvania dairy producers watch both Class III and Class IV markets, as well as cheese, whey, butter and nonfat dry milk, to understand what CME price action will mean for their own individual milk checks.
