**Center Grant Programs:** The Vision of the Center for Dairy Excellence is to "Serve as a catalyst for a vibrant Pennsylvania Dairy Industry," while the Mission is to "Empower and support Pennsylvania dairy families and businesses to thrive." To help meet our Vision and Mission, the Center for Dairy Excellence opens its grant programs each fall to dairy farmers across the state. This year we have five different grants to help Pennsylvania dairy farmers address needs they may have within the scope of the grant.

The first three grants are for different types of teams. Grants available include Dairy Profit Teams, Dairy Transition Teams, and Dairy Transformation Teams. The Dairy Profit Teams work with producers in an advisory role to address bottlenecks or other issues limiting profitability. The Profit Team recipients are reimbursed up to \$1,500 for paid team members, discovery-related costs, and lawyer fees. Profits teams generally consist of the farm's most trusted advisors, with a facilitator that coordinates the meetings and workflow. The second grant within the Team Grant program is for Dairy Transition Teams. This grant is designed to help farms establish a team to develop a transition or succession plan. This grant can reimburse recipients up to \$3,500 for paid team members, discovery-related costs, and lawyer fees. The third Team Grant is for Dairy Transformation Teams. This option allows producers considering a major business transformation to apply to receive up to \$3,500 to establish a team to help navigate and plan the desired transformation. Please note that manure storage facility improvements do not qualify as eligible projects as there are state and federal programs that can better help you accomplish these projects.

The fourth grant the Center offers is the Dairy Decisions Consultant Grants. This program is intended to provide dairy farm Prices change daily. Historically, this grant has paid for a financial con-





sultant to help analyze your finances and help you identify areas within your business that could improve your cashflow or bottom line. This grant program was expanded this year to cover five key areas in addition to financial. The five new areas include: employee management and communication, business planning and structure, product marketing and labeling, direct marketing, and animal welfare. Recipients can receive up to \$3,500 in funds to work with a Dairy Decision Consultant. The application process for the above grants is open now and will remain open until the funds are exhausted.

The last grant available to dairy farmers is the Dairy Excellence Grant, and it is a competitive program. The grant is designed to help you make improvements to cow comfort, milk production per cow, or efficiency of your dairy. This grant offers a 50% match up to a maximum match of \$5,000 to approved applicants. You can apply online at www.centerfordairyexcellence.org/dairy-excellence-grants. The application period is open now and will close on October 15, 2021. Since this is a competitive grant, you are asked to fill out and answer all questions completely as your application will be scored individually by each member of the selection committee. The highest scoring applications will be awarded the grants.
